Wednesday we went thru the Temple — Then Gran was sent to the camp at 1:30, by the way he had a special permit from the Bus of the Temple to go thru the temple first session. — The ones going for the first time go on the Second. If he could not have gone that way he would not have been able to go — for they would not let him off. And it was by special permit that he got off Friday night from 6 to 10. They are so strict now they won't let any one up to the center nor let the boys out. I was so thankful they let him come to see us that night. He looked fine in his clothes — perfect fit. Well we took him up as far as they would let us. We said good bye, and watched him enter —

pass the guard - and go on his way. He had to walk about two blocks. Now we must hope and pray for him. It seemed it was not right - but we could not say a word.

The next day we came home.

Have not had a word from since.

We got your welcome letters - Thanks so much. Wesley & I have both been sick since we came home. Helen was sick when we got here and may Ida was sick last night. She would love to go down to you, but has been waiting to know what Helen is going to do - and has not made up her mind for sure. Helen got a telegram from Carl to say he expects to be transferred - when he is sure he wants her to go. I guess she will, but again I am not sure.

I think they will write very soon and let you know. Thanks for asking her to come.

We are having a long cold winter a real "Bear Lake" last night - snow and wind. I have a head ache - will not try to write more.
