Dear Mother and Dad,

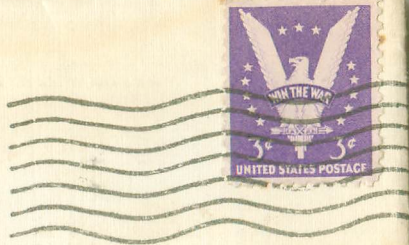
I'm feeling much better today and am up and about the ward. I feel a little weak but much better today than I've been since I became so ill. I expect to be out of here soon now as my temperature is sticking right to the normal.

Today it looked like I had hit the jackpot. Six letters came all forwarded from Florida but one. There were two letters from North American that you forwarded. One asking me for my present Army address & the other a notification of some money due me and deductions. I am writing ~~to~~ right back to them as the letters have been a month in reaching

me.

Then I received two letters
from Grandma one mailed to
me here at Illinois. I have
written to her several times
and this makes three letters
I have had from her. From
her letters I think there must
be another. She was expecting
Mary Ada but she hadn't arrived
in Long Beach on the 25th of Feb.
Then I got the one you forwarded
from Wilford Arnovity. And
one from Gareth Low. He was
in Las Vegas, Nevada on Feb. 8
and may still be there. He said
he got the candy in January and
he sure liked it. Wanted to know
if my sister was still Eligible.
He said the boys would all like to
meet her and mother too. He would
like to meet all my folks. (Aunt Ada
thinks Gareth would be a fine match for
Mary Ada.) He's really a swell fellow
and a great pal. Well so long for
now and I hope you are all well
