I am wearing glasses now to read the fine print <sup>which</sup> ~~it~~ is necessary for me to get my lessons. I sure would like to come back to Long Beach & go in the ocean again. I take charge of the law library two hours a day every other week for \$10 a month which helps out a lot but doesn't pay my tuition since it costs more for tuition & fees than I can make at that rate.

Helen came in last week as it was conference. She & Mother had a nice visit. I took her to one dance & this week I am going to prove & I think I will stay over for the dance.

The twins are glad to have

me back here. The new arrival  
is sure a cute little girl. She  
has a lot of dark hair & is a  
good little baby. She doesn't get  
her clothes all dirty as some  
babies do.

I am going to mutual & if we  
keep on planning more parties we  
are going to be busy. We have a  
harvest ball planned for the 31st  
& we are going to decorate the hall  
as an old barn & everyone is to  
come in old clothes as if they would  
go to the harvest. I think I will  
wear a red flannel shirt & my  
overalls. We expect to have lots  
of fun. Besides the harvest ball  
there are about four or five other  
parties or such.

I hope Grandpa is getting along  
alright. How is Ricky enjoying  
school now & what is Beulah  
fee doing. I have written some  
to Aunt Sada & have tried not  
to say the same things.

Oct. 12 / 1939.

Dear Mother Pearl - I hope you are well. And that you did not worry much about Dad. I was going to write after, but the Baby got sick and we thought it best to bring him to Salt Lake in case they had to have a Dr. So Helen & I came with him on the train the day after Dad left. I asked K.L. to write & tell you. I hope he did. I have not heard from anyone telling how Dad is. Wesley wrote that he had a card saying he was not so well but expects to get "quick results". I sure hope he is better.

Mother has been very bad - had such a lot of pain. The last few days she seems better. We had her sitting on the <sup>side</sup> edge of the bed with her feet on a chair, last night & to night. Harry, Uncle Hyrum, Alfred and Ab Sparks were here over the weekend - They came down for conference. I went down to one meeting

Thursday afternoon. It was  
fine. and such a lovely day.  
The flowers were beautiful.  
I have been pretty busy.  
Emeline came from the  
hospital Friday. She feels fine  
and the Baby is a little darling.  
She hardly cries. We are all so  
thrilled that she is a girl we  
haven't found a name for her  
yet. She should have a pretty  
one. Was glad Helen could come  
in last Saturday.

I have been here three weeks  
It seems a long time. Coe plan-  
ned to stay a month and Wesley  
would come down for me  
but it has been so stormy  
he has had a lot of trouble  
getting the grain in. I don't  
know if he can come now or  
not. The girls write that they are  
getting along alright. They want  
to come down to see the new  
cousin. Tell Ida and family  
hello. Have been thinking of you  
all a lot. I hope you will write  
to us soon. Mother & Emeline  
send their Best Wishes.
