in the whole state of Conn.  
I first heard of Uncle Fabian  
and the two girls being safe  
when I saw it in the paper  
Monday February 26. I almost  
floated clear out of the  
door and would have if  
I hadn't had a case study to  
complete and get in -  
Finished it at 1:40 ~~PM~~ that night.  
Then Mavis letter came  
saying that you had heard  
from Aunt Beulah - I'm so  
excited and I don't see how  
you could be much more  
excited although I know  
you are. It's so wonderful.  
I guess our prayers were  
answered.

As an anticlimax on  
the same day I read about  
my boy friend's plane and



his description of an attack  
on a Jap tanker - The long  
1000 mile trip home after  
the pilot was blinded and  
the co-pilot killed - Yes  
this past week has been  
very eventful, exciting and  
making a great many happy.  
With the end of the war and  
before a great stock of unbelieve-  
able stories are going to come  
forth.

Spring has - really come to  
New Haven. The bay, and  
Long Island sound in the  
distance from my window  
tell me that. The sun is  
so nice and Jim certainly  
counting the days and weeks  
until I can get home.  
July and August will be  
hot and those hot hatteries.

With four weeks of night  
hour duty behind me and  
two case studies in certain  
the rest of the time will fly.  
One case study was 22 pages  
long and the other I gave orally



took an hour.

Two of my four weeks on  
8 hr duty were spent in the  
Diet Kitchen making special  
diets - my partner - also a name  
Ic - major just flew in & got things  
done. He had decided not to tell  
them that we knew anything about  
caching so it was rather  
funny when our supervisor  
said "Now when you make  
meringue - beat the whites  
stiff first then add the sugar."  
Yesterday she asked me "Have  
you ever made chocolate  
pudding before"?

Well I'm trying to write 10  
letters tonight and get caught  
up on some that I've had  
for over two months.
