Saturday Jan 11th 1890

Dear Sister Nora: yours of Christmas
morning received some time since.

Mitchell weighs 30 pounds. I was
astonished for that is all Byam
did when baby was born but
I think ^{he} would go at least 35
now for he is fatter and heavier
than aunt Lizzie's Willie.
Is it not too bad about poor sweet
little Hazel? and poor Lydia. I
think the poor soul must be nearly
heart broken. I could not go up
to the funeral for my own sweet

Babies sake you wanted to know
the particulars concerning pas charge
well all I know is he went to
Priso and was charged with Murder
and the time of trial is in Feb-
some time he had to employ
two Lawyere (Mormons) and they
said it would cost him at least
\$1.000 and maybe his life in the
