She stayed a week and saw the  
most of our relatives they were all  
very pleased to see her of course she  
did not go a visiting she saw them  
at the meetings they wanted her  
to stay and make them all a visit

but she could not for she had to  
come back when the rest did

Your boys are doing fine I  
think they look as happy as larks  
they were all up here yesterday  
they go to all the Sunday schools  
and I think that the woman they  
live with takes them to the Sunday  
evening meetings with her

Nora I have got your calico quilt  
all pieced all ready for the red  
calico to set it together

How is Will now I hope he is  
well before now I have a bad  
cold and of course I caught a good deal,
