I was in hopes you would be home while I was in Logans it seems such a long time since I have seen you.

You must be sure to come up here for a while when your school is out.

Are you getting tired of teaching when are you a going to get married?

I have just been writing a letter to Caroline Brother and Sister Samoseaux were up here Monday she told me of seeing Ma, Mary and you in there Saturday I was glad to hear from you all.

Your God son has quite a cold and is
very cross. The rest of us are well
I think we are having such miserable
weather now. I have not got acquainted
with hardly any one yet - and it is
quite lonesome but I like the place pretty
well it. It blows a great deal and the wind
is quite bad. I asked Orrell what I
should say to Aunt Sara and he said
"Say I've got some little chickens"

Ruth's baby is not very well.
I wish some of Mrs's folks would come
up here and see us. Archie's folks are
up here so much and none of mine have
been here at all only Alvin D. and that
was along time ago

If Archie does not take these letters to
the post-office to night - they won't -
go before Saturday night - it is
so stormy I don't know wheather
he will go or not - I saw the Photo
of your school house and school

I think it is very nice you look very
natural, did you have a nice time
in Salt Lake conference
