Dear Children

Received a letter
from you a few days ago I should
have answered it directly I got it but I did
not have time and your Father did not
give me any answer about the stove
but now he says that you can have it he
thought that it would be to small but he
says that I can send it this week We are
going to kill our pigs in the morning and
I want to go to the temple the next day
so I do not know exactly what day I can
send the stove but will send it this
week Willie thinks we can send it on
Tuesday if we can we will and you can
let me have feathers when you get them
if you like. We are all well as usual
your Father is fixing to go to meeting

the steps are not in town to stay George
has been to Ogden and got back the
same day they wanted him to answer
questions in your Father's case and bro
Tensens case. It is George's birthday
he is twenty one I will send you a few
flowers it is the last rose of summer
I will send you one off of your large
geranium I am so sorry that your
flowers are frozen if they are froze
now you might as well throw them all
away for they will be sure to freeze
solid before spring Well I do not
know hardly what to write there is
not much news we have plenty of snow
it is about six inches deep but the
weather is very pleasant the little
boys are teasing me to let them go
and slide down the hill Oh how
I wish I could see you all I think you
shortened your baby rather young its
being so very cold too have you made

him plenty of breeches to keep him
buttoned up good and warm you must
be sure to keep his legs and feet
covered up good when you go out with
him and be sure to warm his feet
good every time you take him and
not let him freeze his feet
I hear that Delia is homesick
tell her for me that she must
not be homesick for It will do no
good but just wait until she gets
ready to start for home then she
can get as homesick as she wants
to. I did not know as any of
John's relatives was sick and
Roxie does not know what you
meant Willie is still after Alice
I think I heard the other day that
Mary Reece was a little better she
can both see and hear better she
has been very low for a long time
so that her husband had to quit
