Dear sister I feel that I had better write to you and let you know how we are getting along we are all well except Barbara and she is very looser she has not been expected to live saturday night was her worst time but this after-morn she is a little better the doctors says they can do nothing for her we have doctors here but never evry day for three weeks but she does not seem to improve evny whaterver she has got sees she lacks the sight of a doctor she has no faith in them well i think that I have told you a bout all our troubles s guess you got popo letter which was written in hast the day before popo left well nora I would like to see you all and kiss my two darling boys that is G & W for I think of them every day well

nora I have heard lots a news
since come down espdy since papa
come down about a certain person
but you dont believe half you here
so its best to say nothing about it
I guess your at home all the time now
so we heard down here clara and
george wheeler had busted up and I
think she is very ~~all~~ foolish if it
is all true what I have heard for
I dont think she will ever get a letter
one well nora there is going to
be lots ~~more~~ of insigment this
week but none for me unless there is a
great change in health well you must
excuse my bad writing for I havent
went to school for so long and am
out of practice but i think i
will go next tuesday well nora you
must kiss all for me I guess clara
has left bides, are she would
of ~~me~~, answered my letter

ore else dont want to answer
it is told here to right if ~~or~~ she
felt like it and i guess ~~or~~ she
dont care she would have written
~~but~~ I only wrote as a friend and
never have been a friend of it
I would not of written but she
told me to before I left but never
mind I guess I wont say over
it if I ever get a letter well nora I
started to write last evening but
never finished till this morning

my letter to a close write soon
