Dear Bern

I will try and answer
your kind letter which I received a few days
ago we was very glad to get it you may be
sure I would have answered it sooner but
I did not feel well I had a very lame back
and I get very tired Rosie and the children
are here she is sick and John is away to
work Flynn and John Crockett are
getting a long splendid with Rosie's house
but they will have to quit to night for
they start to College manday I hope
Henry will be here to night so he can
start too I hope you feel better than
you did when you wrote you must take good
care of your self and I want you to take
extra good care of dear little Lee I hope he
is getting all right you did not say any

thing a least than in your letter
we have very nice weather here
Your Fathers health is very poor but is a
little better now I have just got my new
carpet home from the weavers 5-8 yards
it is very nice. The Breston folks were all
well as common the last we heard also Selia
and family I am owing Selia a letter
Your Fathers Cousin Ella husband and
two children have been here on a visit
they were on their way to Maine where her
folks live. I think she is very nice your
father had a rig and took them all over
town they liked the place and the people
first rate you must kiss the little boys
for me Give my love to all that enquire
after me if there is any one that cares
enough for me you must write soon
to your loving Mother

Logans Sept 2nd 1877

Dear Sister Nora. I will drop
you a few lines but dont know
whether you can read them or not
I am at Ma's sick I have been
sick 3 weeks last week I was
unable to take a step or to turn
over in bed alone and was down
home alone with the children
when father hired a man and
a team a week ago to night
and came after me and here
I still am. I am improving
but slowly. I can now walk
a short distance and can use my
right arm but to day my left
arm hangs help less at my side
and my right one threatens to be
no better by to morrow. I want
to hurry and get well for the
plums will be ripe by another
week and I want some my
self and some for you.
