I hated to make a check on you but I thought that would be the quickest way - I did not know but you were needing it. Old Sue died yesterday. She had got so

every day. She could stand good - when
she got tired of standing she would
turn round facing the other way and
lay down in a good position. I would
send her a bucket of milk every day -
Then she took the pneumonia and
would not eat and soon died. She had
gotten so she would help when they tried
to get her up. And she could stand good.

It looked like summer here till the last
two days. Night before last it snowed about
5 inches and last night it froze terribly.

This morning again the sun is shining.
Gint's out fit came back here to do a little work
and he got on a big "drount".

I have heard from all the kids lately and
they are all right. The A. J. D. is now the
Idaho Tee. College.

We are all well. I hope you take good care
of your self and keep well. You might that day
have worn your good clothes and taken your
work clothes along but I did not think and I guess
you did not. It is the Relief Society's big time here
monday but I won't be there. With Love your
