I don't know just when she will be fit to travel. I surely wish Dad's vault were fixed so we could bring him up and get that taken care of. I can never feel that I can quit worrying till he is laid away where he wanted to be.

I don't know Wesley, if you remember when my mother had her last sickness - she was <sup>many</sup> months that she could not lie down - but had to sit up in a chair all the time.
